If you are a family whose child/ren are in receipt of the Pupil Premium Grant, we just wanted to confirm that you will receive a voucher for payment of meals during the Christmas Holidays. The supermarket vouchers will be to the value of £35 to cover the period of being away from school and will come straight to your email inbox before the end of term.

Fundraising Thank You and Reading Books: →

Last academic year, we had a fundraising drive to raise money to purchase new reading books for the children. Thanks to your generosity at the Summer Fair, various show performances, the purchase of photographs, alongside of the donation from the HSA and a bit of school fund, we have been able to purchase some new reading scheme books. Some of the children at school have been talking a lot about Squid Games, which is inappropriate for children to watch as it is age-rated 15+. The content seems to be accessible on media platforms such as YouTube as well. Please check your parental controls and settings very carefully on all devices at home. Thank you.

Approved by the Charity, we believe in promoting equality, fairness and respect and will not discriminate on the basis of race, ethnicity, religion, gender, age or sexual orientation. This guide is intended to help parents and carers understand the potential risks posed to young audiences by the nine-episode Netflix-exclusive TV show, Squid Game. The series, rated 15+, is about a world where contestants who are closely monitored play children's games in order to win cash prizes. The losses, however, are violently inflicted. The show's popularity has meant it has spread in various guises across online platforms, with a heightened risk of children and young people potentially viewing unsuitable content. That's why we've created this guide to help parents and carers understand exactly what Squid Game is all about.

What Parents Need to Know about SQUID GAME

AGE RESTRICTION 15+
Suitable only for 15 and over

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT
Some might argue that Squid Game has grown in popularity and prevalence on other platforms, like TikTok and YouTube, with clips of the show going viral. On YouTube alone, a number of successful channels have taken advantage of the Squid Game trend, creating content such as 'How to Beat Squid Game Characters' videos. Its popularity has also led to the creation of app games that put the player in the role of a contestant who is killed if they lose a game.

VIRAL SPIN-OFFS
As well as Netflix, Squid Game has grown in popularity and prevalence on other platforms, like TikTok and YouTube, with clips of the show going viral. On YouTube alone, a number of successful channels have taken advantage of the Squid Game trend, creating content such as 'How to Beat Squid Game Characters' videos. Its popularity has also led to the creation of app games that put the player in the role of a contestant who is killed if they lose a game.

SCENE RE-ENACTMENTS
Squid Game's pervasive presence on social media has led to many content creators to re-enact scenes from the show, which has led to reports of children wanting to also imitate those actions at home and in school. Much of this content stems from the 'Red Light, Green Light' game from the first episode, where contestants attempt to run away from a giant animatronic girl before she catches them.

APPEAL TO YOUNG PEOPLE
Whilst the content is very much adult-themed, some features seem to appeal to young children of the game. The name 'Squid Game' may be interpreted as a reference to children's games rather than adults. The content itself, such as the bright and colorful aesthetic, may also appeal to young children, particularly as there is a focus on playground games to go with it.

SIMILAR CONTENT SUGGESTIONS
When using social media and streaming sites, content is recommended based on what the user has consumed or what they have watched or searched for. Therefore, there is a greater chance of your child being exposed to similar violent or horror-themed content as you browse through other watching on these sites Squid Game.

Advice for Parents & Carers

USE PARENTAL CONTROLS
Netflix has easily accessible built-in parental controls that allow you to set on a profile for your child with a specific age restriction. There are also a range of other tools and even lock their accounts so it can't be accessed by anyone else. Netflix also allows you to access your child's viewing history to make sure they are not watching anything inappropriate for their age.

MONITOR ONLINE ACTIVITY
Squid Game has become a social-media craze and it's possible your child will see some content related to the show as various platforms. Therefore, it's important to be aware of what websites your child has visited on their smartphone, tablet or laptop, and to also keep an eye out for which accounts they are following on social media platforms, such as Instagram and TikTok.

MONITOR BEHAVIOUR
Due to the viral nature of the show, even if your child has not seen Squid Game, it's important to keep an eye on their behaviour. There have been reports from schools of children 'playing Squid Game' in the playground and acting aggressively towards the teachers as a way to replicate the consequences of losing in the TV show. Viewing content that makes your child feel uncomfortable could also cause them to feel distressed or distressed, so it's important you can easily spot the signs.

CHECK AGE RATINGS
Age ratings on TV shows and films are a good indicator of what your child is watching. If you are unsure about the content your child is watching, check the age rating to see if the TV show or film is appropriate for their age group. If not, try to find a suitable alternative or talk to your child about why it's not suitable for their age group.

HAVE OPEN CONVERSATIONS
Making sure your child is comfortable talking to you about what they see online can go a long way to ensuring you are kept in the loop about their online life. Having an interest in what your child is doing online gives you the opportunity to discuss what is not appropriate for their age group, and how they might recognise their own feelings towards content they see.

WATCH THE SHOW
If you're trying to figure out whether you should let your child watch Squid Game, it might be a good idea to watch the show yourself first. Doing so will allow you to get a better understanding of the show's content and themes, as well as help you decide if there is something you feel comfortable with your child being exposed to.

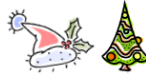

Can you help us support isolated older people in your community?

Silver Salisbury very much wants to support older people in minority groups who live in Salisbury but we need YOUR help!

Silver Salisbury is our very successful programme of activities to help older people get out and about and enjoy life, helping to relieve loneliness and isolation in old age.

We now have a little funding from Salisbury City Council to help us ensure that EVERYONE in our community is included.

To help us make sure we are truly inclusive we now want to recruit someone from a local minority group to join our team

The job is to

- ✓ work with an identified minority community group in Salisbury to identify the needs of older people, especially around isolation and loneliness
- ✓ Consult with older people in the minority community about the services they need
- ✓ Work with local service providers, including health, local authorities and voluntary groups, to explore what will make their service more accessible to this specific community.
- ✓ Work with the Silver Salisbury team to create bridges so that the community feels welcome at Silver Salisbury events:
- ✓ Explore whether the minority community could welcome visitors to their own events as part of the Silver Salisbury programme

This is a new role with funding initially for one year: we are seeking funding to continue to develop this work. Initially it is for 160 hours a year (13/14 hours per month). The pay is £15 per hour payable on presentation of an invoice.

You will need to

- Be a member of a minority group represented in Salisbury
- Be fluent in English and your mother tongue
- Live in Salisbury or nearby
- Have good communication and communication skills and be able to engage with people as individuals or in small groups
- Be able to present a report on what you have found out
- Have an NI number or work permit
- Hold or be willing to have a DBS check

The closing date for applications is Sunday 4th December and application is by e mail to silver.salisbury@outlook.com enclosing a CV and letter of application.
